First Afternoon assembly

I would like to thank the many parents who joined us at our first Friday afternoon assembly conducted last week, and the community as a whole for the support we have received for this initiative. In addition to the growth this demonstrates for our Year 6 cohort as they build agency, it supports teachers to facilitate deep foci on learning outcomes each Monday morning as students commence their week.

BSC Band Visit

Last Tuesday we welcomed musicians from Bentleigh Secondary College to perform as part of their two musical groups. Our students were able to see and hear instruments that they are not regularly coming into contact with, while Mrs Wylie prompted



children to think about the opportunities that may exist for each of them as part of their Secondary Schooling. As always, we value opportunities to mix with local educational colleges, to enhance transitions and pathways for children moving beyond Year 6 at Hughesdale Primary School.

Parent Opinion Survey

The time of year has again come, where we generate a random sample of families and conduct a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 23rd July to Sunday 26th August.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

As mentioned by Lisa, our new format and time for Assemblies have




Welcome Rango

Hughesdale Primary School.


News from the First Aid Room


