George, Vasilis and Archie from Year 1B shared their Poetry about their mum where they focussed on writing structure and their personal best penmanship. Well done boys!

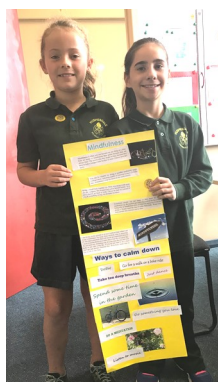

Another successful working Bee!

A BIG thank you to all the families who came along to assist at our Working Bee last Sunday. Working alongside each other we were able to achieve a wide variety of tasks such as:

- Installing the goal posts and fitting the goal pads
- Aerating and re distributing the soft fall around the playgrounds
- General gardening / weeding of all garden beds around the school
- Spaying weeds in carpark
- Blowing leaves and debris off the artificial grass areas
- Spreading manure in the garden beds
- Adding Dynamic lifter, pea straw and potting mix to Vegetable gardens
- Digging a trench and fitting a tap near the bike shed to facilitate the watering of the student garden beds
- Filling potholes in car park with gravel

Next week, some of our students along with Mr Welsh will be visiting John Monash Science School to do experiments. This program is run by Year 10 and 11 students who are given the opportunity to learn about communicating science concepts, as well as making science fun and engaging for a younger audience. Young students share their excitement for science, and are able to ask in-depth questions.

It is a wonderful opportunity for older and younger students to work together on experiments such as egg drops, to understand the effects of gravity. 'Little scientists' work through several topics during the term, and then choose a topic or question that interests them to do their own science project.

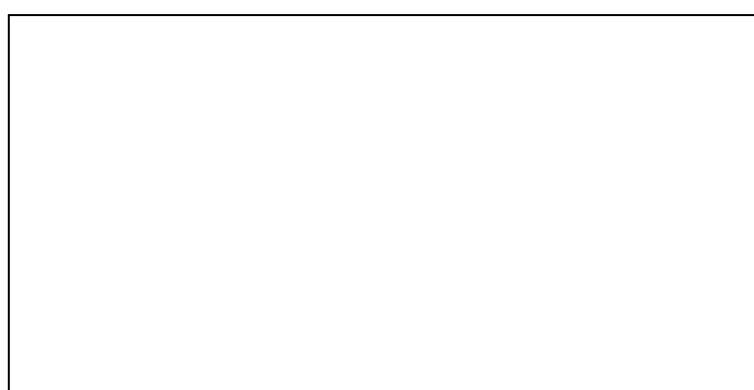
