#### **Foundation Welcome**

Always an exquisite moment for our community, we have welcomed 89 young people to our school within Foundation this year. Often a bittersweet moment for parents, I must congratulate each of you on the way this cohort has settled so readily, so quickly.

Worth highlighting is the fabulous support being offered by our Year 6 students, your parents should also be commended for helping you become the caring young men and women I see working with our younger learners this year.







#### **Hot Day Flipped Timetable**

This year we have implemented a flipped timetable for days of extreme heat. We shift to this schedule to ensure that students spend time outside prior to the heat of the day, with careful inside play for a shorter time in the afternoon. We have deployed this new schedule on two occasions thus far, with very very positive outcomes. It is pleasing to see children getting an opportunity to play outside, while removing exposure to the peak heat times. A decision to flip the timetable is made based on the forecast, with the expectation that on days predicted

to be warmer that around 35 degrees, staff will be informed prior to 8:45am that a flipped timetable will operate.

#### **Lunch Orders**

A really brief reminder; I have noticed that a number of lunch orders are being delivered to the wrong year level. Please check that you have updated your child's class within your QKR settings so that your child's lunch is delivered to the correct classroom.

#### Uniform

Thank you for the feedback received about the increased ease of accessibility provided by having uniform available at a retail store. We have also been asked about Second Hand Uniform.

We will continue to collect second hand uniform, and when sufficient stock is available, a Sale will be advertised, enabling purchase of these items at a ridiculously reduced cost.

I am pleased to share that we are having our first <u>Second Hand Uniform</u> <u>Sale</u> after our Whole School Assembly on Friday 14th of February.

If you have items that you no longer require, and you wish to donate them

back to the school, please feel free to drop them off in Mrs Breeden-Walton's office (near reception).

#### **Cyber-Aware Learning**

I came across a resource that may appeal to parents just commencing the cyber-safety journey with their young children.

With the use of Big Ted, Jemima and other well known characters from *Play School*, materials have been designed to help families with young children kick off good online safety habits.

The Family Tech Agreement is the first of eSafety's newly developed Early Years resources, being rolled out in 2020 to support children under 5 and their families.

#### **Travel Safety**



It is with great excitement that I write my first newsletter article at Hughesdale Primary School. I have been warmly welcomed by staff and had the pleasure of meeting some parents. The students have demonstrated the value of respect showing kindness to me with a smile, a hello and even stepping aside politely to offer me doorway entry. My Assistant Principal role is leading Curriculum and Pedagogy. I have most recently come from a Leading Teacher role in the North East Region of the Education Department. I worked in partnership with school middle leaders to develop collegiate collaboration that continually improves literacy teaching practices in response to student needs. Prior to this I was a Classroom Teacher, of all year levels, at a school in the outer eastern suburbs where 70% of the students had a language background other than English. It was a rewarding experience and helped me learn so much about literacy learning and teaching. This year I will continue as a Monash network course facilitator for Literacy Leaders at Bastow Institute of Educational

Leadership. I look forward to learning more about your children and working with the fantastic teachers here to further strengthen the rigorous learning environment provided for all students to reach their potential.

#### **Curriculum Day 1**

Each year four days are set aside at government schools where students do not attend and the staff engage in professional learning together. We started the year with all the staff engaged in learning to ensure we have a great start to the 2020 school year. Topics covered included:



#### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

#### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### **HOW TO APPLY**


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.


#### Term 1

**The Music School** is again pleased to offer **guitar lessons** at Hughesdale Primary School for students in years 1– 6. Please indicate if your child is a continuing student from last year or a new student beginning lessons for the first time.

The cost is \$17.60 per lesson and is payable at the beginning of the term.

Term 1 lessons begin on Wed 5th Feb. There are 8 lessons in Term 1 and the total cost per student is \$140.80. There is a **discount for cash** payments and the cost is reduced to \$135 for this term.

Payment of fees is required within 14 days of the student's first lesson. As in previous years, fees paid late incur an administration fee of \$20.

# HUGHESDALE PRIMARY SCHOOL ONLINE LUNCH ORDERING

- Hughesdale Primary School utilizes an online lunch ordering system.
- A.J.'s Bakery East Bentleigh has partnered with QKR (with MasterPass) to enable local schools to access online ordering.
- The App is free and available to all families to download.

#### Step 1 - Search & Download Qkr! & Install

On your Android phone or iPhone.

#### Step 2 - Sign up (Parent / or Guardian)

Follow prompts on the screen to register.

**i.e** email address – select sign up then follow the prompts as directed.

#### Step 3 - Search

Search for *Hughesdale Primary School* Click on link.

#### Step 4 – Add Profile for your child/ren

When first accessing Hughesdale you will be prompted to add a student profile for your child – *Add Profile* 

Step 5 - Select Menu and Start Ordering









#### Orders must be placed via the App the night before. You cannot order on the same day.

This will take you into the payment section. If you have any questions, please contact the school office.




#### School Banking 2020
