### **Premiers' Reading Challenge**

We are pleased to announce that Hughesdale Primary School is participating in the Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge this year.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 7 September 2018.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 6 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and have the option to have their name included on the online Honour Roll.

Reading is a life-long skill and Mrs Trevaskis is busy organising our school so that all students can track their involvement; shortly, each child will receive their log-in name and password to track the books being read. I am very excited to see how many books our school can read! 


