Always an exciting moment in the school calendar, we welcomed our 2020 Foundation students to school last week for their first Transition session. While there are many children joining us that have older siblings already at school, we have this opportunity to warmly welcome the many families that are joining our community for the first time. A second session is scheduled for next Wednesday 30th October, and the third on Tuesday 12th November.

Our school continues to draw increasing interest for new enrolments, which requires very careful management. In 2020, we will grow from a school of 26 classes, to one of 27. I take this opportunity to thank parents for keeping me informed of new enrolments (siblings, relatives or neighbors) as well as any movement out of our area, and encourage anyone who has not yet done so to contact me as soon as possible if you are anticipating any changes to your child's enrolment status for 2020. It is a very great privilege to be the school of choice for so many families.

Uniform

Mrs Tania Patterson has voluntarily run our Uniform Shop for longer than I have been at the school, and on behalf of us all I thank you Tania. For your dedication, we thank you. For your time, we thank you. For your welcoming demeanor, we thank you.

School Council has reflected upon the service we can offer by continuing to run the Uniform Shop from the school, comparing it to the service offered by Uniform Suppliers, making the decision to move to off-site provision from 2020.

Some of the key considerations for this change include;

- Shortage of volunteers (understandably) to take over from Tania.
- Increasing size of the school.
- The number of families where both parents work, or are unable to visit the uniform shop within the window of time it is open on Mondays.
- The school's investment in stock (which is increasing as the school does).
- Storage space.
- Online purchasing options.

We will shortly be publishing shop details, opening dates, trading hours and online purchasing information to all families so that you can take advantage of the more flexible purchasing options. In the meantime, as we prepare for the transition, we are holding a **Uniform Sale** at the beginning of November to reduce stock holdings. Gratitude is one of Hughesdale Primary School's values. It is important to acknowledge and appreciate the good things that happen in life, it is an essential part of building our happiness. Rather than focussing on what you don't have or what you want, the focus shifts to all that you have. Everyone has times when they are aware of being thankful for a person or a situation. These moments give us a good feeling, it is this that we call gratitude. According to the Resilience Project, they state that:

- In 21 days of practising gratitude, you rewire your brain to start scanning the world for the positives. You become three times more likely to notice a positive.
- In 42 days you;
- O Are less likely to get sick.
- O Have higher levels of energy.
- O Feel happier.
- O Are more enthusiastic.
- O Are more focussed.
- O Are more determined.
- O Are more optimistic.
- O Have a better quality of sleep.

Have lower levels of depression and anxiety.

Expressing and experiencing gratitude doesn't need to take up a lot of time:

- Keep a gratitude journal. Take five minutes each day or once a week to think of three things that have happened to you since the previous day or week that you're happy you experienced.

- Tell someone you're grateful to have them in your life. Whether it's someone you look up to, or someone who just makes you happy, take the time to tell them you're glad they're around.

The eighth meeting of School Council was held on Monday 21st October with a number of agenda items discussed.

Uniform Shop News

School Council unanimously passed a motion to move the supply and management of the uniform shop to **PSW (Primary School Wear)**. As communicated in Council's August report, the reasons for the move are two-fold:

- the significant growth of the school over the last 4 years has put strains on the limited volunteers and space available in the school;
- it was recognised that the varied working hours of parents within the school community can make it difficult to attend the shop on the designated time and day. The move to PSW will provide greater flexibility and more options for parents.

Please note that the last date to purchase items at the school uniform shop will be between 9 am and 10 am on Monday, 11 November.

Please be understanding as we run out of certain items over the next few weeks. Also, please note that any non-logo items that we run out of are available at PSW now, whilst items with our school logo will be available from 27 November 2019.

PSW offers both a physical shop and on-line ordering. The shop is located at Unit 1, 596 North Road, Ormond and is open Tuesday to Fridays from 9 am to 5 pm and Saturdays from 10 am to 1 pm. On-line ordering direct from PSW is also available.

School hats will continue to be available for purchase directly from the school office.

The task of running the shop is a very large one and for the last 4 years has been undertaken by Tania Patterson. School Council formally and sincerely thanked Tania for all of her hard work, extensive time and dedication to this role.

Hughesdale Primary School Strategic Plan 2019 – 2023

The previous meeting gave Councillors an understanding of the school review process that informed development of the Strategic Plan for 2019 – 2023. Discussions in October focussed on the contents and the basis for inclusion of the three key goals and associated strategies in the strategic plan:

- To maximise each student's learning growth
- · To enhance student agency and voice in their learning
- To build student resilience and confidence

Development of the strategic plan is a very extensive process that incorporates findings of the school review and data analytics to inform the school's priorities and focus for the next four years. Councillors were very impressed with the depth of analysis that informs the plan and the care and time taken by the leadership team to ensure the best possible outcomes for our students. The way forward is exciting!

Child Safety Standards

Consideration and understanding of child safety standards is an essential governance requirement for School Council. Councillors discussed the actions and obligations articulated in Child Safety Standard #4 and Child Safety Standard #5.

Religious Tuition

A community member approached Council to consider a proposal that introduces the availability of externally provided religious tuition for families that seek this for their children. Councillors deliberated the potential for such instruction at Hughesdale Primary School and discussed a number of key factors including:

- The need to be equitable across all faiths in our community
- The need to be consistent with the school's key values
- The availability of physical resources to accommodate external service providers
- The potential timing for delivery of tuition

Following careful consideration, Councillors agreed to revisit the topic at a future meeting.

Financial Obligations of School Council

A letter from The Department of Education and Training was shared and Councillors were reminded that the school council is responsible for overseeing the school's financial performance. It is a legal and Department of Education and Training requirement that council endorse funds coming into the school are being properly spent and authorised.

NAPLAN Results

NAPLAN reports outlining growth data for HPS in 2019 were presented and strong reading and writing growth with Hughesdale Primary School the second highest school in the data. Our numeracy results showing growth in the middle band was consistent with the leadership team's expectations and inclusion as a target area in the Strategic Plan for 2019 – 2023.

Buildings and Grounds - final working bee for the carnival

The carnival subcommittee of parents and friends are busily preparing for the upcoming event, The Greatest Carnival. Buildings and Grounds noted that the final working bee for the year that will be to prepare and decorate the grounds for what is expected to be a wonderful night.

Finance

The Council considered and endorsed the Treasurer's reports which are a standing agenda item. Full details were provided from August and September with no significant issues identified.

Proposed essential item fees were presented for 2020 with School Council endorsing an increase in fees to reflect the rising costs of supporting students. The 2020 fees are developed on an equitable basis that more accurately reflects consumption by year level. Council noted that fees have not increased for a number of years.

Mobile Phones (Policy)

The mobile phone policy was presented and endorsed by Council.

The Education (Policy) sub-committee is always very busy and I thank them for their ongoing efforts.
