Penny and Maeve from 4C shared their well researched imaginative diary entries as they walked in the shoes of our earliest European settlers.




Mia and Samantha from 4D shared their application of three school values to their Mathematical learning task - Teamwork, Resilience and Personal Best!





### School Council Report

Dear All,

The sixth meeting of School Council was held on Monday with a number of agenda items discussed.

#### Annual General Meeting – Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September

School Council discussed the upcoming Hughesdale Primary School annual general meeting. As articulated by our Principal, Lisa Gough, the school has been working with dedication this year to review and redevelop our whole school approach to writing, in response to current research and educational evidence. This work has included staff development, working with leading literacy consultant Danny Hyndman.

As a School Council we would like to support our parent community and assist you to understand educational intent behind the school's work, and how you can support your children with this knowledge. Accordingly, we will welcome Danny Hyndman to speak to the community on the evening of Monday September 17th and warmly invite you all to attend.

#### First Curriculum Day for 2019

Council endorsed the first curriculum day for 2019 on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> January. Years 1 to 6 would attend the first day of school on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> January and Foundation on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> January.

#### Camp Australia Fee Structure

Camp Australia has presented Hughesdale Primary School with a three tier fee structure that is expected to facilitate greater control and choice for parents, so that the service can be better tailored to suit the individual needs of their family, while retaining competitive rates for our parents. Prior to formally approving the new model, School Council will be presented with additional information to explain the new structure.


