Our Learning Community

Most of you will have heard me referring to our school as a Learning Community. Consistent with this belief is our ongoing attempt to source relevant, informative speakers for our parent community. I am very pleased to be sharing with you details of our parent information session on cyber safety - a crucial component of parenting that challenges many families. On Tuesday the 26th February, Hughesdale Primary School will be hosting a speaker from the 'ThinkUKnow' organisation to explore this incredibly important topic.

ThinkUKnow cyber-safety presentation

ThinkUKnow Australia www.thinkuknow.org.au is a cyber safety education program that educates parents, carers and teachers on how people are using technology, the challenges they may face online, and how to help them overcome these in a safe and ethical way.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation covers issues relating to children and young people's' privacy and security online, their relationships with other users and their online reputation. It provides insight into the devices young people are using, as well as the popular websites, apps and social networking sites they're accessing.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology.

Icy-poles

There was an incredibly relevant article printed in the Herald Sun on Saturday 2nd Feb (page 17) titled "Sugar Hits A Thaw Point". It has been used to prompt an inquiry by teachers, and ultimately student leaders, into the sugar content and school's approach to selling icy-poles.



Athanasia, Zoe, Sofia and Olivia in Year 6 are leading this investigation and they would appreciate your participation in a Survey. This consultation will mean they can add the opinions of our

community to the student and teacher opinions they will also be gathering.

Hunter and Alex from 5B shared their learning about the power of a growth mindset.




Wolfgang from 1A for 'sticking at it' with resilience and not giving up when learning was tricky.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.







The Music School is again pleased to offer **guitar lessons** at Hughesdale Primary School for students in years 1–6. Please indicate if your child is a continuing student from last year or a new student beginning lessons for the first time.

This year the fee structure will continue as last year – the cost is \$16.50 per lesson and is payable at the beginning of the term.

Term 1 lessons begin on 11th Feb. There are 7 lessons in Term 1 and the total cost per student is \$132. There is a discount for cash payments and the cost is reduced to \$125 for this term.

Payment of fees is required by the student's first lesson. As in previous years, fees paid late incur an administration fee of \$20.

Private Lessons (1 to 1) are available at The Music School studios at 317 Neerim Rd, Carnegie at \$35.90 per half hour lesson, or at \$319.90 for a block of 10 lessons.
